Curriculum and Materials in Early Childhood Education 3 Credits

Description

EDTR 121 – 3 credits – Curriculum and Materials in Early Childhood Education provides a comprehensive survey of developmentally appropriate methodology, materials, and environments for young children with particular emphasis on the 3 - 8 year age group. The course addresses the use of curriculum and materials to differentiate instruction in order to meet the needs of diverse populations.

Prerequisite: EDTR 120

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. identify the role of parents in the education of their children;
- 2. describe effective behavior management techniques;
- 3. examine childcare professional organizations, professionalism and ethics;
- 4. compare various early childhood programs;
- 5. analyze learning styles, universal design for learning and the impact on lesson planning;
- 6. compare formal and informal assessment techniques;
- 7. differentiate screening, formative, summative, and ongoing evaluations;
- 8. examine current trends addressing diversity in early childhood curriculum and materials;
- 9. construct play-based, child- centered, developmentally appropriate curriculum activities;
- 10. demonstrate effective verbal and written communication in an early childhood setting;
- 11. create developmentally appropriate objectives; and
- 12. design inclusive lesson plans based on current curricula

Course Requirements

Other Course Information

This course, along with EDTR 120 together fulfill the 90-hour child care hours required by the Maryland State Department of Education for child care teachers in preschool centers. Therefore class attendance is mandatory. This means if a student is absent more than four times (two times for an evening once a week course including hybrids) he or she will fail the course. The first 45 hours, EDTR 120, must be successfully completed prior to enrollment in EDTR 121.
