Description

ENGL 254 – Contemporary Themes in Literature: Explores a specific literary, social, or historical theme through selected reading-fiction, essays, letters, autobiography, poetry, and drama.

Pre-requisites: ENGL 101

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Formulate an extended definition of the theme;
- 2. Analyze significant themes, attitudes and issues in the works studied;
- 3. Analyze literary presentations of the themes as they emerge from the works studied;
- 4. Evaluate aesthetic, social, and moral issues as they emerge from the works studied; and
- 5. Demonstrate the ways in which their views of the issues have changed in response to the works studied.

Major Topics

- I. Theme in literature
- II. Social and moral dimensions of literature
- III. Literary analysis
- IV. Evaluation of literature
- V. Writing about literature

Course Requirements

Grading will be determined by the individual faculty member, but shall include the following, at minimum:

- Participate actively in class discussions
- Write essays totaling at least 2,500 words
- The final grade will be based on the students' writing, graded either cumulatively or in an end-of-the-course portfolio.

Written assignments and research projects: Students are required to use appropriate academic resources in their research and cite sources according to the style selected by their professor.
