Pronunciation/Spoken Conversational ESOL 3 or 6 Contact Hours

Description

ESOL 096 – 3 or 6 billable hours; 0 credits – Pronunciation/Spoken Conversational ESOL develops communication skills ESOL student need to succeed in an academic and/or professional setting. The course presents learning strategies, which develop fluency in oral communication and accuracy in listening comprehension. A variety of interactive activities involve learners in practicing skills that can be applied in real-life situations. A highly structured approach to pronunciation focuses on the sounds, stress, rhythm and intonation of English.

3 or 6 billable hours; 0 credits; 3 or 6 lecture hours per week Prerequisite: Eligibility for ESOL 032 or above; courses offered every fall and spring semester.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. Use oral communication effectively in a variety of English contexts;
- 2. Comprehend basic spoken English in a variety of contexts;
- 3. Understand and apply word stress patterns appropriate for the American English language system;
- 4. Recognize and pronounce English phonemes;
- 5. Pronounce English using appropriate rhythm patterns and focus emphasis;
- 6. Use and comprehend appropriate intonation patterns for spoken English;
- 7. Recognize and use a wide variety of American idioms appropriately;
- 8. Participate in English in-group discussions with classmates;
- 9. Make individual presentations to the class;
- 10. Create and perform informal dialogues for the class;
- 11. Develop and perform formal interactive speaking interviews in class; and
- 12. Learn vocabulary associated with the class topics;
