Description

PEMJ 114 – Soccer: enables physical education majors to develop individual skills, offensive and defensive strategies, and team concepts; provides coverage of basic principles of teaching soccer.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Perform the basic ball control skills;
- 2. Demonstrate the offensive skills of passing, supporting, and shooting;
- 3. Demonstrate the basic defensive skills of marking, tackling, and covering;
- 4. Demonstrate knowledge of rules, history, and team tactics;
- 5. Demonstrate knowledge of offensive and defensive systems;
- 6. Analyze technique and supply corrections; and
- 7. Create and implement a teaching lesson.

Major Topics

- I. Ball control skills including dribbling, trapping, and heading
- II. Offensive skills including passing, supporting, and shooting
- III. Defensive skills including marking, covering, and tackling
- IV. Game situations including throw-ins, corners, and direct and indirect shots
- V. Offensive tactics and systems
- VI. Defensive tactics and systems
- VII. goalkeeping
- VIII. History and rules of the game
- IX. Strategies for teaching soccer skills and team concepts

Course Requirements

Grading will be determined by the individual faculty member, but shall include the following, at minimum:

- Written exams and quizzes
- Skills test
- Technique evaluation
- Teaching presentation and lesson plan
