Description

Diagnostic Studies I

Provides proficiency in performing, ordering and interpreting diagnostic studies. Covers ordering and interpretation of radiographs, imaging studies, and electrocardiograms; gives students opportunity to perform 12 lead EKG studies. The first of three courses.

Overall Course Objectives

The student will be able to:

- A. Perform and record an EKG;
- B. Interprete EKGs including assessment of rate, rhythm, axis, hypertrophy and infarct;
- C. Apply principles of radiographic, ultrasound and magnetic resonance imaging;
- D. Discuss methodology of radiographic interpretation, including cross sectional anatomy;
- E. Identify the normal chest and abdominal film; and
- F. Explain uses and need for special studies.
