Common Course Outline RTTT 105 Introduction to Clinical Education 2 Credits

Description

RTTT 105 – 2 credits – Introduction to Clinical Education introduces students to clinical aspects of Radiation Therapy through simulated lab and clinical rotations.

2 credits; 240 clinical/lab hours Pre-requisite: RTTT 101; Admission to the Radiation Therapy Program; this course is only offered in the fall semester Co-requisites: RTTT 103, RTTT 111, and RTT 125

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the students will be able to:

- 1. identify physical and mental limitations of patients;
- 2. Use appropriate precautions regarding patient transfer;
- 3. ensure and maintain patient privacy;
- 4. demonstrate proper use of universal precautions;
- 5. appropriately interact with members of the radiation oncology teams and other healthcare professionals to provide multidisciplinary care to oncology patients;
- 6. communicate effectively with appropriate medical terminology;
- 7. demonstrate ethical and professional behavior in the clinical environment; and
- 8. demonstrate how to accurately measure patient distance/depth.
