Description

RADT 223 – Radiographic Pathology: a course in which students are introduced to the concepts of disease. Pathology and disease, as they relate to various radiographic procedures, are discussed. Topics include terminology, morphological classifications of disease for each body system, the role of radiology/medical imaging in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases, and alterations in standard imaging procedures. 1 credit hour: 4 lecture hours per week; 4 weeks. Offered spring semester.

Pre-requisites: RADT 221

Co-requisites: RADT 224, RADT 225

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. define terms related to pathology;
- 2. discuss manifestations of pathological conditions and their relevance to radiologic procedures;
- 3. describe the morphological classifications of disease for each of the systemic classifications of disease, describe etiology, examples and site, complications and prognosis;
- 4. explain the role of radiology/medical imaging in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases discussed in each of the systemic classifications;
- 5. recognize pathology that requires an alteration in standard imaging procedures;
- 6. assess the appropriateness of ordered radiology/medical imaging exams; and
- 7. provide appropriate assistance in exam interpretation.
