- 6. identify factors which impact Transportation, Distribution, and Maritime Logistics (TDML);
- 7. discuss global ethics and cultural diversity awareness in TDML;
- 8. recognize career pathways in the TDML industry; and
- 9. demonstrate an applied knowledge of the complete cycle of transportation and logistics.
