Description

VETT 223 – 1 credit – Veterinary Surgical Procedures and Anesthesiology Laboratory provides the student with the opportunity to apply the information and skills presented in VETT 203 Veterinary Surgical Procedures and Anesthesiology and participate in typical surgical procedures encountered in a veterinary clinic.

1 credit: 3 laboratory hours

Pre- requisites:

VETT 203 with a "C" or better.

Overall Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. perform a physical examination;
- 2. determine intravenous drip rates;
- 3. calculate accurate dosages;
- 4. perform intravenous catheterization;
- 5. administer intravenous fluids;
- 6. perform pre-anesthetic laboratory procedures;
- 7. monitor patient during a surgical procedure using standard veterinary equipment;
- 8. utilize the various types of inhalant anesthetic delivery systems;
- 9. perform endotracheal intubation;
- 10. perform proper dental prophylaxis and tooth extraction;
- 11. perform sterilization of surgical packs;
- 12. prepare the surgical room for a surgical procedure;
- 13. perform patient preparation for surgery;
- 14. perform recommended surgical scrub and dress in appropriate attire for assisting in the surgery room; and
- 15. apply bandage or splint to patient using standardized procedure.
