SRTC 250 Surgical Capstone

3 Credits

Description

SRTC 250 – Surgical Capstone: allows students to transition into the role of the professional surgical technologist. Students discuss a variety of topics to include clinical performance review and feedback, resume writing and interview skills, clinical preceptorship, professional continuing education, current developments in the profession, and review of practice certification results. The course also includes a comprehensive review of the discipline areas to prepare the student for the certification exam.

Pre-requisites: SRTC 210 Co-requisites: SRTC 278

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. evaluate the performance of the clinical preceptor;
- 2. critique performance in the clinical setting through constructive feedback;
- 3. employ appropriate constructive feedback techniques;
- 4. submit a professional resume and cover letter;
- 5. perform acceptable employment interview techniques;
- 6. compare traditional and non-traditional employment opportunities for the surgical technologist:
- 7. outline the benefits of professional memberships and certification;
- 8. discuss current developments in the profession;
- 9. interpret performance on the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (NBSTSA)'s self-assessment exam (practice certification exam); and
- 10. formulate a plan of action to review problematic areas of performance on the self-assessment examination.
