Description

DIGM 153 – Video Editing and Media Management teaches editing techniques, skills, and principles to demonstrate the storytelling power of editing. Students use editing techniques to edit footage from media shot during their digital media production courses.

Students edit their projects to include video, effects, titles, music, and diegetic sound. Students work on a group project journaling their experience.

- 6. give and receive peer feedback in a constructive and respectful manner;
- 7. collaborate with peers on shared video editing project;
- 8. evaluate the needs and concerns of user groups; and
- 9. manage media assets to facilitate collaboration with peers.
