Description

EDTR/MNGT 204 – Early Childhood Management: is a course in which students examine the operation and administration of an effective childcare program in terms of management, health, and safety. Topics include needs assessment, site selection, environmental design, personnel, parent relationships, community resources, recordkeeping, business procedures, regulations, marketing, and legal issues. NOTE: EDTR 204 is the same as MNGT 204. Earn credit for one only.

Pre-requisites: EDTR 121

- 2. identify techniques for parent participation;
- 3. assess the operation of a center;
- 4. develop a philosophy and handbook;
- 5. develop an annual budget;
- 6. describe Office of Child Care (OCC)/State of Maryland regulations for personnel; and
- 7. describe State of Maryland OCC regulations for the facility.
