# EDTR 261 Evaluation of the Exceptional Child

3 Credits

### **Description**

**EDTR 261 – Evaluation of the Exceptional Child:** examines the process of assessing various disabilities as set forth in special education legislation, providing an overview of the basic statistics and properties of testing measures, formal and informal methods of assessment, and the interpretation of those assessment measures. The following areas of functioning are explored: intelligence, perception, behavior, language, academic, adaptive behavior, and social-emotional.

#### **Overall Course Objectives**

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. calculate the basic statistics used in educational assessment;
- 2. identify the history and foundations of assessment;
- 3. examine the legislation relevant to the evaluation of students with disabilities;
- 4. analyze the difference between informal and formal measures;
- 5. facilitate formal and informal academic assessment;
- 6. review the process of assessment in the other areas of development;
- 7. interpret culturally and linguistically appropriate measures and procedures; and
- 8. examine ethical issues in assessment.

# Major Topics

- I. Basic statistics
- II. Historical, legal, cultural, and ethical issues in assessment
- III. Assessment of the various disabilities:
  - Intellectual impairment, specific learning disability, emotional disturbance, autism, speech/language impairment, visual impairment and blindness, hearing impairment and deafness, deaf/blindness, traumatic brain injury, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment including ADHD, and multiple disabilities

# Course Requirements
