# Classroom Management/Teaching Techniques for Exceptional Children 3 Credits

#### **Description**

**EDTR 264 – Classroom Management/Teaching Techniques for Exceptional Children:** students examine teaching techniques for use with children with varying exceptionalities, developing classroom procedures and schedules to fit the needs of diverse learners. Through the study of behavioral theorists, students will create a behavior management plan that takes culture and development into consideration.

#### **Overall Course Objectives**

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. demonstrate strategies used to effectively manage a classroom;
- 2. compare various classroom management techniques;
- 3. identify models for selecting, modifying, and developing instructional materials;
- 4. develop an appropriate schedule(s) for maintaining classroom behaviors;
- 5. evaluate models of classroom discipline for strengths and weaknesses;
- 6. examine behavioral techniques used for classroom management;
- 7. analyze appropriate use of each behavioral management/classroom management techniques:
- 8. identify cultural issues within the classroom with a focus on classroom management;
- 9. analyze behavioral theories and the application to classroom management; and
- 10. create a behavior management plan to be used within the classroom environment.
