Description

KNLS 182-183 – Cooperative Education I: Kinesiology: provides academic credit for knowledge and skill outcomes derived from 90 to 135 hours of planned work experience in the students' chosen career field. Students gain entry-level career-related experience and workplace competencies, which employers value when hiring new employees.

Pre-requisites: KNLS 240, (KNLS 140 or KNLS 231), (KNLS 134 or HLTH 232), and permission of Program Coordinator

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. participate in an employment search process;
2. apply appropriate workplace behaviors in a professional setting;
3. develop measurable field experience learning objectives with the program coordinator and site supervisor;
4. evaluate progress toward achieving listed learning objectives;
5. demonstrate knowledge and skills appropriate to job assignment;
6. demonstrate evidence of increased content knowledge gained through practical experience;
7. evaluate the experience in terms of personal, educational, and career needs; and
8. prepare a resume that includes the experience and skills acquired during the internship.

Course Requirements

Grading will be determined by the individual faculty member, but shall include the following, at minimum:

- Completion of 90 hours (2 credits) or 135 hours (3 credits) of documented work experience in a work hours log signed by the site supervisor
- One written field experience report which will include the work hours log, self-evaluation form, site supervisor evaluation, and program coordinator evaluation
