Common Course Outline NURN 130 Concepts of Nursing Success 1 Credit

Description

NURN 130 – Concepts of Nursing Success introduces students considering a career as a Registered Nurse to the essential concepts related to the nursing profession and the nursing school experience. Active learning and simulated experiences assist students to transition into the nursing program and the role of the nurse in today's healthcare environment.

Pre-requisites: (ENGL 052 and RDNG 052) or ACLT 052

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. describe the historical evolution of nursing as a profession;
- 2. explain the role of the professional nurse as a member of the health care team;
- 3. summarize the responsibilities and accountability of the professional nurse in the practice setting;
- 4. define critical thinking and how it relates to safe, effective and professional nursing care;
- 5. explain the relationship between nursing and evidence-based practice to improve patient care outcomes;
- 6. give examples of how information technology influences the delivery of nursing care;
- 7. develop a personalized list of essential skills, behaviors, and coping strategies for making a successful transition into a professional course of study;
- 8. communicate effectively using standard academic English and APA format;
- 9. construct a beginning level nursing care plan that demonstrates appropriate selection and use of critical thinking strategies and caring behaviors for patients through a simulated high-fidelity lab experience; and
- 10. write at least 3 personalized goal statements that reflect a commitment to a career in professional nursing which includes lifelong learning and scholarship.

 - C. Application-based learning (lab, simulation and clinical)

Course Requirements
