Common Course Outline HORT 230

Landscape Design 3 credits

Description

HORT 230 – 3 credits - Landscape Design explores the principles and practices of landscape design while building upon basic graphic skills; special emphasis is placed on the proper and effective use of plant and landscape materials within various types of landscape plans and designs. Two Saturday Class Practicals are required.

3 credits; 2 lecture hours and 2 laboratory hours per week.

Prerequisites: HORT 107

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. define landscape design;
- 2. explain the various types of landscape design;
- 3. identify and properly use drawing instruments;
- 4. lay out a drawing sheet;
- 5. draw a title block;
- 6. use various lettering styles;
- 7. visually perceive proportion and scale;
- 8. develop symbols for various plant materials;
- 9. discuss and explain the various elements of design: proportion, contrast, symmetry, balance, unity and rhythm;
- 10. develop a base (site) plan;
- 11. analyze a site;
- 12. determine the need for topography modifications;
- 13. draw topography modifications and give construction details;
- 14. conduct a client interview to determine their needs and desires;
- 15. discuss the relationship of indoor and outdoor areas;
- 16. list the space requirements needed for specific outdoor activities;
- 17. design both a public and a private area of a landscape;
- 18. determine irrigation requirements and their use in a landscape plan;
- 19. use water features effectively in a landscape plan;
- 20. utilize LCA standards in landscape drawing;
- 21. create a residential design;
- 22. create a commercial design;
- 23. create and present a landscape drawing, and
- 24. read and estimate a landscape plan and prepare a bid.

Major Topics

- I. Basic principles and theory of landscape design
- II. Principles of landscape design through the use of landscape drawings
- III. Interpretation of landscape drawings and location of designs on the ground
- IV. Functional uses of plants in the landscape

Course Requirements

<u>Grading/exams</u>: Grading procedures will be determined by the individual faculty member but will include the following:

- 1. Lab Drawing Exercises (minimum 2)
- 2. Lab Applications of Landscape Drawings (on the ground) (minimum 2)
- 3. Three (3) Written Exams
- 4. Two (2) Saturday Class Practicals
- 5. Participation

Other Course Information

This course is a Horticulture Program core course required for the Horticulture A. A. S. Degree.

It is also a required course for the Landscape Design and Installation Certificate.
