#### **Description**

**VETT 212 – Pharmacology and Toxicology** provides instruction in basic pharmacology and medication administration. Students examine the effects of drugs on a variety of animal species. The manner in which toxins affect animals is also discussed.

  - 6. discuss the components of safe medication administration for various species;
  - 7. demonstrate competency in dosage calculations;
  - 8. examine the procedure for maintaining the veterinary pharmacy and drug inventory;
  - 9. execute the procedure for recording controlled substances; and
  - 10. examine the toxicology effects of drugs on the body's systems.
