Description

ALHT 260 – Leadership in Health Occupations: explores issues in today's integrated healthcare environment. Students learn to apply strategies to manage policies, procedures, and challenges that impact patient outcomes and the quality of the healthcare facility.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. discuss historical and contemporary factors that have influenced the development of healthcare in the United States;
- 2. describe the role of providers within the healthcare environment;
- 3. explain the importance of patient advocacy and its impact on patient outcomes;
- 4. compare and contrast leadership and management roles in integrated healthcare systems;
- 5. identify ethical behaviors in relation to professional conduct and the influence of these on organizational effectiveness;
- 6. Identify local, regional, and national laws and accreditation standards that regulate healthcare professionals and facilities;
- 7. evaluate how cultural diversity and personal belief systems impact healthcare decisions;
- 8. analyze the impact of healthcare reimbursement on access to care;
- 9. create a standard operating policy/procedure for a healthcare facility; and
- 10. create a healthcare organizational chart and define the leadership roles.
