DANC 237 Dance Composition

Description

DANC 237 – Dance Composition: introduces compositional concepts and structures, and the use of space, dynamics and rhythm as choreographic tools in dance making. Students create original dance work for formal or informal presentations.

Pre-requisites: DANC 137 or consent of the Dance Coordinator

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. utilize improvisational skills in a variety of methods as a means to generate movement phrases;
- 2. apply a wide variety of choreographic devices to manipulate a movement phrase;
- 3. utilize the concepts of various choreographic structures to create movement studies;
- 4. apply choreographic elements such as phrasing, forming, abstraction, style, theatrical elements, music/sound, and/or props to a movement motif or phrase;
- 5. create original movement works utilizing choreographic structures;
- 6. demonstrate elements of movement and how they relate to a choreographic theme;
- 7. analyze the use of music in choreographic studies and works;
- 8. discuss aspects of costuming and the impact of costume choices on choreographic works;
- 9. apply principles of dance production technical elements to movement studies and choreographic works;
- 10. compare different choreographic styles and approaches;
- 11. articulate a personal aesthetic as it relates to choreography;
- 12. create and perform dance studies for solo, duet and group arrangements;
- 13. analyze and articulate the choreographic process and effectively give feedback to chorographic assignments; and
- 14. analyze the choreographic styles and performance from a live concert and articulate appropriate criteria for making interpretations and judgments about dance.

 - c. Elements that lead to successful creation of dance works
 - d. Feedback Process
- II. Production Elements
 - a. Elements of accompaniment: silence, sounds/text, and music

Course Requirements

Grading will be determined by the individual faculty member, but shall include the following, at minimum:

- Creation of movement phrases for in-class activities
- Weekly journal descriptions and responses to class and outside activities throughout the semester
- Attendance at a live professional dance concert with a written response
- One additional written assignment
- Create three choreographic studies or works
- Attendance at the CCBC Dance Concert with a written or oral response

Written assignments and research projects: Students are required to use appropriate academic resources in their research and cite sources according to the style selected by their professor.
