Description

ALHL 102 – Allied Health Leadership II: Acknowledges articulated industry credit for prior learning by national certification in an accepted allied health care field. The course provides academic credit for achievement of allied health competencies in a structured field of study that is subject to overall direction or guidance and that adheres to relevant principles, practices, and domains of study.

Pre-requisites: Successful completion of a national certification in one of the accepted allied health care fields is required; ALHL 101. Enrollment in this program requires permission of the Allied Health Leadership program director.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. demonstrate cognitive and practical, hands-on skills required to carry out tasks within a field of study or work;
2. demonstrate ability to facilitate and perform complex tasks;
3. recognize correlations between functions and procedures based on stipulated scope of practice criteria and interpret results;
4. acknowledge different perspectives or approaches within an area of study or a work environment;
5. articulate relevant information on specialized knowledge;
6. demonstrate basic interpersonal and communication skills required to learn and exchange knowledge with others; and
7. display behavior consistent with the ethical and legal standards within a field of study.

Major Topics

Topics relate to application of theory, practical skills, and ethical and professional behavior within a specific allied health scope of practice. These topics maintain standard language and cross over domains and competencies obtained from certification guideline resources.

- I. Medical and pharmacological patient history
- II. Patient documentation using specialized technology
- III. Infection and quality control
- IV. Patient education
- V. Quality improvement and specialized health care data sources
- VI. Health insurance and healthcare plans
- VII. Therapeutic procedures across a specific field of study
