Associate of Arts (A.A.) in General Studies Area of Engagement: Accelerated Learning Option Credit for Prior Learning Workbook

Offered Completely Online, In Person Or a Combination of Locations

Introduction

This General Studies Accelerated Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) Workbook stipulates how Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC) students can accelerate completion and/or finish their program-of-study utilizing CPL. CPL course options shorten the time to graduation and reduce the overall cost of the credential.

Apart from a few of the Allied Health program-of-study majors (such as ASN-Nursing), most CCBC majors may take advantage of several CPL options as outlined within this document. Furthermore, the Associate of Arts (A.A.) General Studies declared program-of-study majors will be able to maximize the use of CPL. With careful academic planning and advising, A.A. General Studies majors may complete all but 25% of their program-of-study through CPL. The Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) stipulates that 25% of a program-of-study must be completed in residency (through classroom teaching either online or in-person).

Groups of students that most benefit from the A.A. General Studies Accelerated CPL option are:

- Students that have obtained various Industry Certifications, however for specific reasons are not going to major in the Certification related program of study (e.g., Networking, Aviation Technology, or HVAC).
- Students that have obtained CCBC approved and cross walked Industry Licensures but are not going to major in the related industry major (e.g., Construction Management or Allied Health Leadership).
- Military students or international/heritage and multilingual students that can transfer in several Military/CLEP/DSST/Cambridge/AP/IB or OPI-Language credits or lower-level elective credits that do not satisfy a particular major.
- Out of state/area students that bring many CPL credits, but are unable to select their related major, due to the major not being offered online (e.g., Construction Craft Professional or Automotive Technology).

Students previously enrolled in CCBC Continuing Education courses may be eligible for a CPL fee waiver. Otherwise, courses taken through Departmental Exam or Portfolio Assessment include a fee. No other type of CPL has an associated CCBC fee. If you have further questions regarding these options or CPL fees, contact the Coordinator of Transfer and Degree

Acceleration at <u>PriorLearning@ccbcmd.edu</u>. Any remaining courses not awarded or earned through CPL may be taken in any sequence, online or in-person, as long as prerequisites are met.

Overview: Procedures and Accelerated Options

A student may come to CCBC with a plethora of experiences, looking to complete a credit credential. They may have gained experience (industry or life) or taken Continuing Education Workforce classes and want to advance themselves by completing a Credit Certificate or Degree in General Studies at CCBC. To begin this process, a student needs to:

- 1. Apply to CCBC and declare their program-of-study as the A.A. in General Studies.
- 2. Send official transcripts (from other higher education institutions, military experiences (JST/CCAF, etc.), official scores reports (IB, AP, CAMBRIDGE, CLEP, DSST, OPI, etc.), along with accompanying <u>Transfer Evaluation Request Form</u> to the Registrar's office. The student will be notified via their CCBC email as to the outcome of the <u>Transfer Evaluation Request</u>.

Next, the student will need to contact one of the following to get started:

- General Studies Coordinator (Dr. Danielle James, djames@ccbcmd.edu),
- Coordinator of Transfer and Acceleration (Nicole Zampino, nzampino@ccbcmd.edu),
- an Academic Advisor,
- or their Workforce Program Coordinator.

The student will be advised if their General Education Math and English coursework is completed. If not, they will either take the placement test at CCBC or use CPL to complete this General Education Requirement. CPL options are listed on page 3 of this document for Math and English. General Education Math and English coursework must be finalized within the first two semesters at CCBC.

The Academic Coordinator, CPL Coordinator, or Academic Advisor and the student will review the requirements, steps, and options to complete the Accelerated degree step-by-step.

Types of CPL and Procedures

In-depth procedures for receiving CPL credits can be found online in the <u>CCBC Credit for Prior</u> <u>Learning Assessment Guidebook</u>. Likewise, all current CPL options, along with approved CCBC courses, and any requirements for those courses are listed on the <u>CCBC CPL</u> webpages.

Area of Engagement: Accelerated Learning Option

Area of Engagement Courses are recommended courses designed to give students the opportunity to explore program and career options. Most of these courses fulfill General Education requirements and can be used to satisfy requirements for other majors.

The purpose of the Accelerated Learning Option Area of Engagement is:

- 1. To minimize time and price point to degree obtainment,
- 2. Provide an online option for students unable to complete an otherwise articulated major that is only offered in person (e.g., Construction Craft Professional), and/or
- 3. For students looking to complete an accelerated degree for workforce entrance or advancement.

Depending on the General Education electives completed, more than 24 credits of electives may be needed to reach a minimum of 60 credits for the degree.

Examples of how CPL can be applied as the Accelerated Learning Option A.A. General Studies Area of Engagement:

1. Block Industry Licensure, Certificates, and Apprenticeships can be articulated.

These are not all inclusive, but shared to give an idea of how the Online AA Degree Program works.

Students that complete a 4-year or 5-year apprenticeship school will have completed close to half of their degree through credit for prior learning (24-30 credits). After taking the required 15 Credits (25%) through CCBC (residency requirement), only 0-21 credits will be needed to earn 60 credits (graduation).

Students must ensure that all General Education requirements and CCBC diversity requirements are completed as well. Students may finish any remaining General Education or elective credits with alternate CPL options such as: CLEP, portfolio assessment, OPI, or departmental exams. Out-of-state students may complete their degree exclusively using CPL and online coursework. Please work with the Academic Advising office to select the correct courses. Advisors will be able to help students use Degree Works to check for any remining completion requirements.

2. International/heritage and multilingual students can transfer in many CLEP/Cambridge/AP/IB or OPI-Language credits.

These are not all inclusive, but shared to give an idea of how the Online AA Degree Program works.

Below is an example of how a multilingual student that is fluent in Spanish and Korean, and who has intermediate Mandarin proficiency may be able to articulate their linguistic skills into the A.A.
