**Description**

**ALHL 202 – Allied Health Leadership IV:** Acknowledges articulated industry credit for prior learning by national certification in an accepted allied health care field. The course provides academic credit for achievement of allied health competencies in a structured field of study that adheres to relevant principles, practices, and domains of study.

**Pre-requisites:** Successful completion of a national certification in one of the accepted allied health care fields is required; ALHL 201. Enrollment in this program requires permission of the Allied Health Leadership program director.

**Overall Course Objectives**

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. demonstrate cognitive, administrative, and clinical skills in a required practicum setting or through work experience;
2. demonstrate specialized technical skills and/or use of specialized equipment in a designated health care field;
3. demonstrate ability to anticipate and act on relationships between assignments and tasks and to define viable alternative approaches as needed;
4. recognize correlations between functions and tasks based on stipulated scope of practice criteria and evaluate results;
5. assume responsibility for learning and for the outcomes of structured activities in familiar and novel contexts;
6. exercise autonomy in a field of study subject to overall supervision;
7. report patient outcomes including both normal and adverse events;
8. demonstrate interpersonal skills required to communicate effectively about solutions to complex problems; and
9. display behavior consistent with the ethical and legal standards within a field of study.

**Major Topics**

Topics relate to assessment of theory, practical skills, and ethical and professional behavior within a specific allied health scope of practice. These topics maintain standard language and cross over domains and competencies obtained from certification guideline resources.

- I. Medical conditions and treatment modalities
- II. Use of specialized equipment to generate data, report findings, and analyze results within scope of practice for a field of study
- III. Pharmacology and medicine administration within scope of practice for a field of study
